RIPROARING THUNDER STORMS, UFOS OR CHIGGERS MAY CONFRONTUS. WELL,


BESIDES CALLING UPON THE LORD, CROSSING HIMSELF A FEW TIMES AND SPRINKLING

MINUTES OF THE GENERAL MEETING

October 6, 1973

A full report on the San Diego Directors meeting was given by Ed Martin. A chart, made up by Mr. Mechem, was shown of member locations nationally and also a chart of Directors and other appointees and their various duties.

There followed a discussion on future rally sites. Francis Carroll suggested a site in Texas near Kerrville as a possible fall meeting and told of some of the points of interest nearby. His suggested site was to be considered and checked in to.

There being no further business, meeting closed at approximately 3:45 P.M. followed by the drawing of prizes to lucky ticket holders.
