THE APRIL RALLY. HERITAGE RANCH/LAKE NACIMIENTO, SITE OF OUR 315 ULTRA CLUB RALLY, WAS HOSTED BY TOM & GINA CHRONES. THIS WAS ANOTHER ULTRA EVENT WHICH MAKES IT WORTH-WHILE TO BELONG TOTHIS EXCLUSIVE, ACTIVE AND LIVELY CLUB. IT WAS QUITE A CONTRAST TO OUR RYAN CAMP RALLY HELD IN JANUARY AT JOSHUA TREE NATIONAL MONUMENT. INSTEAD OF ROCKS, HUGE BOULDERS, FLAT DESERT AREAS AND JOSHUATREES WE WERE TREATED TO BEAUTIFUL GREEN ROLLING HILLS DOTTED WITH STRAY CATTLE AND WILD HORSES. BESIDES THE BEAUTIFUL RALLY SPOT PROVIDED FOR US, FREE OF CHARGE, THERE WERE NUMEROUS ENJOYABLE ACTIVITIES : HORSEBACK RIDING, SOME ERSTWHILE COWBOYS AND COWGIRLS TOOK A FEW TUMBLES OFF THE SPIRITED HORSES

BUT NO ONE GOT HURT. WE VISITED AN OLD, PIONEER GRAVEYARD. TOOK A RIDE, ON FRIDAY, IN AN OLD LONDON DOUBLE-DECKER BUS TO CAMBRIA PINES LODGE FOR DINNER AND DANCING. FILL WITH GASOLINE OR KEROSENE. REPLACE PLASTIC COVER ON COFFEE CAN. SHAKE THOROUGHLY, THEN POUR OUT GASOLINE. REPEAT THIS SEVERAL TIMES UNTIL YOU ARE SURE THE FILTER IS CLEAN. PLACE FILTER UPSIDE DOWN TO DRAIN. RESULT; CLEAN OIL FILTER AT A SAVING. REPRIGERATOR: IMPROVED PERFORMANCE BY REMOVING FROM COACH AND LETTING IT STAND UPSIDE DOWN FOR A DAY OR SO. WHILE FRIG IS OUT, BLOW OUT THE FLUE, CLEAN BURNER, CHECK & TIGHTEN ALL PROPANE AND ELECTRICAL CONNECTIONS; BE SURE THE BURNER IS ALIGNED WITH THE FLUE AND THAT THE THERMOSTAT SENDER IS IN THE FLAME. WE COVERED OUR FRIG, TOP, BOTTOM AND SIDES WITH FIBERGLASS SHEETS BEFORE PUTTING IT BACK. FRIG WORKSLIKE A CHARM, PROPANE TANK: NOTICED PROPANE GOING DOWN REAL FAST. FOUND A LEAK AROUND PACKING NUT OF SHUT-OFF VALUE. DON'T TRY TO FIX THIS YOURSELF. TANK HAS TO BE EMPTIED TO FIX. TAKE IT TO A SHOP WHO CAN DO THE JOB. OIL CHANGES: WE FOLLOW PROFESSOR FRED LEARY'S IDEAS ON DIL CHANGES. FRED PROBABLY CHANGES HIS OIL OFTENER THAN HE CHANGES HIS UNDERWEAR - BUT IT SURE PAYS OFF. MINUTES OF THE GENERAL MEETING - April 19, 1975
Heritage Ranch, Paso Robles

The General Meeting was called to order by President Mory Snyder following the Saturday evening potluck dinner. He extended a welcome to all.

President Snyder called for an acceptance of the minutes of the previous meeting as mailed to all members. With a slight correction of dates for the FMCA Convention to July 14-15-16, a motion was made by John Heide and seconded by Ernest Newhouse to accept the minutes. Motion passed.

Rally Master John Heide reported 28 coaches had so far arrived (30 total attended the 4 day rally). A prize was given to Tom & Evelyn Sheffield for having come the farthest distance - all the way from Portland, Oregon. Milt and Jean Reyburn were awarded a token prize for having come the shortest distance. A reminder was made to collect all trash and leave the premises clean before departing from the rally site.

Hilda Green was called on to give a report on the social activities. She thanked Bill & Rachael Helander for their willing and efficient task done in setting up the coffee hours. She also reported the FMCA rally at Salem, Oregon to be held July 14-15-16 and our Ultra Club national rally to be in Canada at Roberts Creek, B.C. (tentative dates July 23 to 29) to be hosted by Len & Edy Ryerson. Also that the Sea Cavalcade would be August 8th. Members will receive further details on exact dates and complete data in the flyer to be mailed soon. Suggestion was made for those attending to arrive other than the week-end to avoid the very heavy ferry traffic Friday to Sunday.

Silent Valley in the mountains above Banning, Calif. was suggested as our October rally site with Jellystone Park in the apple country near Yucaipa, Calif. as an alternate location. Frank & Edith Xiques would report later on the Black Canyon Air Range and Organ Pipe Park locations, both in Arizona, as possible sites for the January 1976 rally.

There would be no camping charge to Ultra members, who could come as guests of the Newhouses since they are members of the Silent Valley Club. More information would be forthcoming after further negotations with Silent Valley officials.

A report from the Secretary indicated that the mailing to non-members from the original list of sales of Ultra Coaches has been quite successful. There were requests for information about attending the July rally, several new memberships, and reports of coaches being sold.




