1980 INFLATION UPDATE

"Inflation, depression, prosperity...when a pendulum swings, it usually swings back."

After my last article I was asked to continue to write up any pertinent economic developments. Therefore, offered below is a "gist" of what the Advisory Services and the best financial minds in the world have been saying lately. Of course, the material here will not apply to everyone...because some families have already taken the steps necessary to ease the effects of inflation. However, if you have not, then this could be one of the most important pieces of paper you have ever held in your hands. That is, if you decide yet to make some moves, even this late, to cover yourself. There is no place to hide. Most of us can figure out for ourselves at least a few methods to diversify enough to provide some inflation and/or deflation protection during this period when the economy is coming unglued. Everything will turn out fine for those who are prepared. I am very optimistic for America. Now...if a reader feels that this 1980 UPDATE (which gives an "insight" BEHIND the economy) will not be of assistance, or that it might DISTURB him, please...use your option to stop reading here.

Many of you already know that most of the nation's large banks, like City National and Chase Manhattan, recently raised the prime interest rate up to 15 3/4%, the highest in all time U.S. history. This event will no doubt be reflected everywhere as the results trickle down into the economy. It will add to the cost of doing business and eventually will reach the retail price structure. Therefore, with occasional ups and downs, we almost know for certain... what to look for in the long run...MORE INFLATION, followed they say sometime in the future by a bust.

No Family, no City, no Nation can spend more than it takes in for very long, without serious or dire consequences. The U.S. National Debt, we are told, is now growing by more than \$1 Billion a day. It is difficult to even begin to comprehend such a sum...ONE BILLION of anything is a tremendous total. One billion minutes ago Christ was walking here on earth. Now, each day, the National Debt increases another billion dollars...and there seems to be little concern by our government to reduce the very freightening deficit which is the engine of our present inflation.

Iran is lost! Will Saudi Arabia be next? Even now, while Iran hates us, burns our flag, takes our Diplomats hostage, most of the other Arab Nations are still accepting our depreciating dollars for their black liquid crude. If they should suddenly decide to take only the ECU or some other European "basket currency" in payment for their oil, as they have threatened to do if ours loses another 5% in value (which it has done since they said that) the American dollar will drop like a stone overnight. Even though it be head-over-heels in debt, our government will not go broke. It prints the money. It is our money that is going broke! That is your reporter's opinion. I'd

Several members have asked us to explain more fully about purchasing American Express Travelers Checks in stronger currencies (like the Swiss franc). Well, large banks sell them, usually charging a fee of 1% to buy or sell. You do not have to go to foreign lands to cash them in. At any future date you can convert them back to dollars locally. If the dollar has dropped in value meanwhile, you PROFIT, since your Swiss franc checks will buy more of them. No one can predict for sure, but the Swiss currency is considered one of the strongest in the world. This would be just one_other_way to diversify which most Advisors urge we should.

There seemed to be quite a bit of interest at both of the Inflation Survival Meetings during the National Ultra Rally at Hannibal, Missouri. Guess we attempted to solve all of the world's problems, plus our own? One thing can be said, no one in this club is ignorant of the financial debacle still facing us. Now if the Economists could predict exactly if and when and how serious those problems will turn out to be! The sessions at Hannibal were requested by several of the members and my hope is that we were able to be of some help to those attending. If there are any further questions on the subject, please feel free to call or drop a note and I'll do my best to provide the answers or find the information desired.

Like was explained at the meeting, the continually "increasing prices" (on everything) are trying to tell us something - that there is less and less confidence in printed green paper. With the <u>reduced security</u> it affords, everyone wants more of it to compensate. More and more people are learning to get their money into something solid and substantial and into real things ...thus <u>out of dollar-denominated</u> assets as much as possible.

There are around 300 MILLION PEOPLE in this country. At this writing perhaps less than 5% are yet aware that they are being fleeced like sheep - that's only 15 million who now realize that their savings are going down the drain and they are doing something about it. Just wait until the remaining 285 million (two hundred and eighty five million people) suddenly wake up! If that time should come they will try to unload their worth-less-and-less greenbacks. To WHOM? There will be no escape then. My advisors say that clients must rush to start action on the "Theory of Contrary Opinion" now. One analogy: In Israel it is already too late - last week their annual inflation rate shot up to over 130%.

Will our government call in the dollar and issue a new currency? I ask this because your answer might help you in making future decisions. Economist Harry Browne (I have read two of his books) believes the new currency is already printed. Dr. Franz Pick, one of the world's most respected monetary authorities, has this to say, "I have lived through the destruction of the Czech koruna, the German mark, the French franc...and I'm now witnessing the destruction of the U.S. dollar. It will be wiped out. The U.S. government ...will repudiate its debts by exchanging 20 old dollars for each new dollar...perhaps as early as 1980....our assets are melting away before our eyes." We all realize he may be wrong about this, but two-years ago I wrote SPECIAL REPORT - THE INVESTMENT CLIMATE in which it was pointed out that this could occur. Suggestions were made then on how to cope with such a probability. If Dr. Pick should happen to be right, then that \$10,000 you or I might have on deposit, or in T-Bills, or wherever, would overnight be reduced to \$500. It might be good to get out and re-read that Special Report again now, and also the one issued later reporting on the Monetary Meeting in San Diego (with the Greek Coins on page one). Both of those Postscript Articles on the economy are as valid today as then, except that conditions in general have become worse, much worse. One example: the government admitted inflation rate last year was 9%. Lately it has been 14% plus. Then too, the actual rate is higher than the admitted rate.


Economist James Sibbet says that the precious metals may seem priced out-of-sight right now, but he says, just wait a year or two and the present cost of silver and gold coins will then seem cheap. He gives reasons and they appear logical. It isn't that coins have gone up in price (or anything else) but rather that the dollar has lost its value and buys less.

IT IS ALREADY HAPPENING - some retail dealers are starting to advertise that they will accept silver coins for the purchase of their merchandise. For instance, a Gasoline Service Station in California is selling gas for 10¢ per gallon. Your dimes must be dated 1964 or earlier. Wish all of us had bought a few more bags of them 3-4 years ago! A Land Developer in Missouri is selling full one-acre home sites for \$125 each if paid in pre-65 dollars. A Sporting Goods Store in Oregon has two prices for each item, ie: a Mauser 30-06 Hunting Rifle is priced at \$169.95 (for regular money) or they will sell the same item for only \$23 in 1964 or earlier silver coins. They would rather have the \$23 in coins than inflated currency. Dealers learn fast. I'll bring a copy of this ad to the next rally.

At the second Inflation Survival Meeting held at the National Rally, one member told of his experience at a <u>Savings</u> and <u>Loan Association</u> recently - he had gone in to withdraw part of his deposit and was told he would have to wait, I believe a week or two, for his funds. Some S & Ls are already short on available cash. You may have heard - two of the nation's largest, Home S & L and American S & L, closed their windows (we hope temporarily) to new construction loans about three weeks ago. Some eastern Banks have stopped early withdrawals on certificates of deposit. All this confirms that there is a liquidity problem. Beware.

The CHART at the right from Holt Investment Advisory, indicates the liquidity of our Nation's large banks. By law, the amount of cash on hand to take care of those who wish to withdraw, was required to be 52%. About two weeks ago the Federal Reserve again dropped this by 1%, down now to only 5%. there is a squeeze going on and instead of protecting the public and their deposits, the Federal Reserve relaxed the rules so the banks now loan out more than ever ... have less on hand. It might be pointed out that the loan-to-deposit graph line (in the Chart) has reached a point above the peak of 50-years ago. I am including this Chart because it may help explain another signal that the present economic climate is not the best. Information like this is generally not easy to obtain from newspapers or the like.

Maybe some readers would like to see monetary expert Howard Ruff on television. His half-hour program "RUFF HOUSE" is on the air every week now on about 300 television stations from coast to coast. Check your local TV Guide for time and station.



The banking system was unusually liquid at the end of WWII, but now it is as fully loaned out as it was back in the 1920's. This will affect future business activities in

Back in the 1930s people were more docil than now. They willingly stood in the soup lines patiently waiting their turn. Now things are different and people are more impatient. If the same conditions ever return (perhaps they won't) the situation could very well be quite different. A few rough bullies would probably "capture" or take over the handout kitchens for themselves...so says Economist Howard Ruff. We can imagine the rest of the picture. Ruff says that right now, if you haven't done so, might be a good time to get a year's supply of long-term dehydrated products that will be tasty and nourishing 5 to 20 years from now. It is another way to also further diversify...and reduce dollar-denominated assets.

Millions of younger families in this country are "Nothingaires". They live in expensive new homes...with 10% down. They drive luxurious automobiles ... for so much per month. They have appliances, clothes, every convenience available...purchased with a plastic card. None have had experience with any depression. They will suffer the most when times get rough unless they heed history now. Credit has given them a false sense of wealth.

During our Ultra Coach traveling this fall through Montana, Minnesota, Iowa, Missouri, Arizona, etc., we noted the large number of closed Service Stations across the country. There are thousands of Oil Stations, as well as many thousands of other small businesses, that have gone bankrupt this year. All of us feel sorry for the owners who have lost their life's savings, but You do not read much it is bleak reality due to the turbulent conditions. about this in the average newspaper. Yet, inflation with its disruptive action, could be ended if our government balanced its budget and stopped increasing the money supply. After over 20-years of research and study of the economy. I'm convinced there is no other sound solution.

nternational Moneyline, in the November 14th issue, says, "...there is oing to be another 1929." Also, that one's home (perhaps purchased some ears ago) could be one of the soundest investments. Their twice-a-month nvestment Bulletins are NOT forcasts of doom, but rather (as I hope this 980 UPDATE proves to be) news about the economy that can assist all of us o PROSPER through the next few years of upheaval.


Norld Market Perspective, like the above Advisor, indicates "...there will soon be a rash of bank failures." Dr. E. L. Anderson, Ph.D., says that according to our calculations—the United States dollar is ready to collapse." He has shown by charts how the various indexes, when graphed, show the curves going straight—up now. He claims they can't do this for very ong without crashing straight down. He admits he could be wrong.

here are those who think the government will not let a depression happen gain. They have the "power" to prevent such a problem. Well, they haven't revented inflation. And, with ups and downs, we have lots more of it to ome. On the other hand, some of my readers may not agree even with that? f anyone thinks that the government will soon balance the budget, plus end he deficit, and stop printing funny money, then we'll all admit that quick olutions could soon occur. It is getting late! There aren't too many ways eft to skin the cat.

n this INFLATION UPDATE article for 1980, we have tried to present the atest information from the various Advisory Services for the benefit of Itra Club members. Our club "By-Laws" state that we are bound together


"A gentle heart finds joy everywhere."

I think all of us would do well to keep this in mind when driving any breed of vehicle, be it car, truck, or motorhome. As a "last straw" we can always shift into reverse. Doing that will stop you - skid the tires - might also do transmission damage, although in one case nothing was harmed. Be sure to warn the co-pilot before you do it, or you might just lose her out the windshield. CAUTION: Do NOT use this method except in a dire emergency. Model-T Fords: caution does not apply.

Little boy to grocer: "Where do you keep the wild oats?"

BACK IN 1946 I wrote a book on improving mileage and performance of cars. Now, with gasoline prices going up and up, we might give a couple of those suggestions that will add extra mileage to your car or coach:

(A) At each stop light where you expect the light to hold you over half-aminute, manually pull your Shift Lever into neutral. Doing this will not only allow your transmission to cool down a trifle, but it relieves a load on the engine, helping to increase its life and extend its performance and total road mileage before repair.

(B) Make certain before each trip that your tires are equally inflated, side to side, and with proper air pressure all around. "Proper" means "based on load" more than merely the manufacturer's specifications. We prefer that tires be a few pounds over-inflated, for best gas mileage and tire life rather than a few pounds under. And...always check inflation before driving when the tires are cool - never after driving even though it be only a block.

Upon arriving back in sunny California after almost seven weeks away on the trip to Missouri, I called the Ready Reserve Company, then drove over to pick up our latest order of dehydrated products. 
