Vacuum Gauge Installation: Section 15 -- Page 70

I have not seen a Vacuum Gauge installation by the Ultra factory. Most members install their own. It is best to use 1/4 or 5/16 Aluminum tubing from the Dash area to the engine compartment. Use a rubber tube from the Aluminum tubing to the instrument. Also use rubber tubing from the engine compartment to the tube on the engine. Route this tubing to the most convenient area in your coach. I ran my tubing from the front wheel well along the emergency brake cable tube under the center of the Coach to the engine compartment. 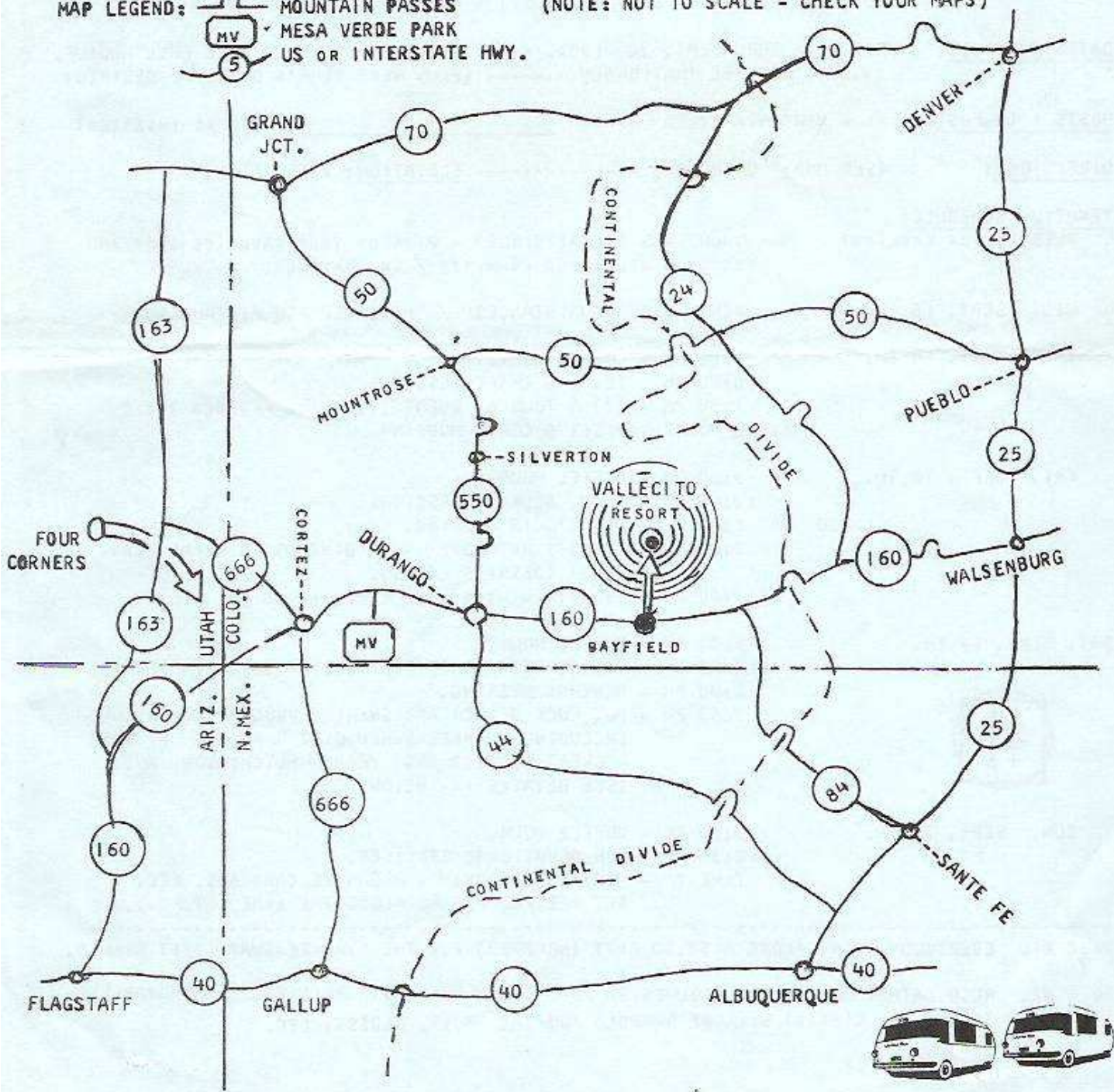
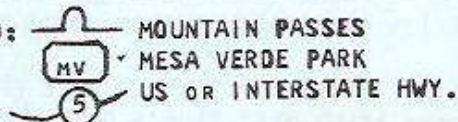

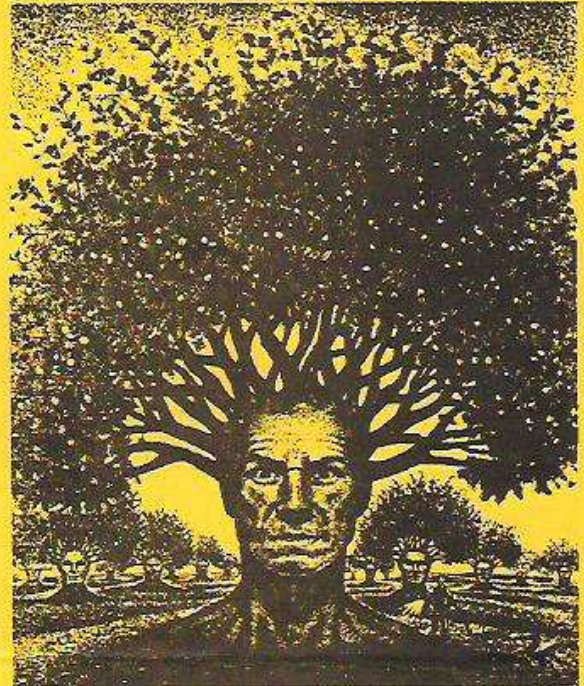
