
the World". How fitting for our "Ultra-conservative" motorhomes!




SHOCK ABSORBER - REAR -- CORVAIR POWERED ULTRA: MANUAL SECTION: 9-52 A desirable replacement: NAPA #2006 x P5 8 7/8 x 13 7/8 R Factor 260/185 (was used in Corvette Front).

NOTE: Spacing of bottom attach studs is 2 3/4" center to center. Elongate existing holes in rear torque arms to accept wider spaced studs of new NAPA Shocks.

SHOCK ABSORBER MOUNTING - REAR -- CORVAIR ULTRA: MANUAL SECTIONS: 9-2, 9-33 & 9-34 DWG:9-BC....Threaded end of Shock Shaft usually "chews" out the upper mounting hole in the I-Beam towards flange edge. To prevent this action &/or correct existing condition bolt or rivet a steel plate to lower flange as shown in DWG. It is necessary to counter bore both steel plate and upper aluminum "Wedge Piece" to accommodate lip of rubber cushion:



Executive Director's Report





WATER, WATER: Did you know that the average person is made up of and carries around about 50-quarts of water all the time? If the seal isn't good all-around, the precious cold air will just pour out onto your rig's floor. That might mean cold feet (and spoiled milk). Here is a reminder -- one good way to check the seal around the door - - take a thin credit card or a post card and slip it between the reefer seal and frame all around. If card feels "loose" anywhere, the seal is poor. Remedy: Warp door to correct, or install new seal.
