




ULTRA RALLY AT EUREKA, CALIFORNIA __ July 25 - 28, 1985

- The service organization known as GIDEONS INTERNATIONAL now operates in 130 different countries. Gideons give out 8,000 Bibles every 20-minutes. I've been doing this for YEARS and one small voice helps.....just think what might happen if every member of our club started writing to his or her State Motor Vehicle Department. Maybe that guy who dumped in the ivy meant his deed to be a simple protest action? But such action....puts ALL legitimate motor home and camper owners in a bad light, to say the least. I'm all for protests when something is not right or fair. However, let's keep our protests VERBAL or WRITTEN and not take violent action like someone did at this otherwise beautiful Roadside Rest.

Mr. TUNA and Miss HALIBUT were discussing their future economic plans. Charlie White Tuna agreed to do most anything for his good friend Annie Pink Halibut, saying "I'm NOT doing this only for you, dear. I'm doing it mostly for the halibut."

The Eureka Ultra Financial Seminar was attended by 20-

plus club members. Each was supplied the names and toll-free numbers of five American investments that have been earning about 20% annually for the past five to ten years. 20%---no, that's not an error---one paid 31.2% last year Statistics show that around 97% of the public keep their "nest eggs" in Savings and Loan Associations, Credit Unions, or Bank deposits. Average interest rates on such deposits have dropped down to 7-8% lately... with only about $5\frac{1}{2}\%$ paid in many areas on Super-Now or Passbook accounts. The majority of citizens do not realize their considerable loss each year from keeping their savings in such vehicles. After inflation eats up part of the BUYING POWER of the original deposits and, perhaps, income tax takes its toll on the meager 8% or so earnings, they are just breaking even or maybe losing ground in certain cases. Quite a few club members have sound deposits in other currencies. During the session we mentioned "Deposit Accounts" but neglected to discuss "Certificates of Deposit" or "Stock Funds" or "Bond Funds". The latter three items have had a better earnings record than Deposit Accounts ... and there is no Swiss withholding tax on these three. As everyone knows, the American business climate indicates a slowing trend --- the U.S. dollar has declined 15% since its peak last February. Some club members are retired on a pension which provides good and sufficient income. Several have taken a forced "cut" in their checks. Pension Trustees explain, "The fund hasn't been able to earn enough to pay the full pension sum." For what it's worth, from a conservative standpoint, we continue to advise wide DIVERSIFICATION for each family's investment portfolio. Maximum safety can be achieved in no other way, in our opinion. The "consensus opinion" of leading analysts seems to agree.

VITAL STATISTICS: The "trip of life" is fast from adolescence through puberty---on the way to becoming a Senior Citizen. By the time your face clears up....your mind gets fuzzy. Ha, ha. Some even begin to leave behind their camp chairs and leveling blocks:



TECHNICAL WHALE TALES



"Technical Whale Tales is a collection of technical tips submitted by Ultra Van Motor Coach Club, Inc. members. Whale Tip: Fall 1-85, Portable Engine/Transaxle Removal and Installation Fixture (Corvair only) Ref. Manual Section 13, Page 12-13.

The purpose for this unit is to be able to remove and install the complete engine and transaxle assembly as a single unit, whether you are on the road somewhere or at home. It is designed so that you can take it apart and carry it in your coach. (See Drawing #1, Louis Griggs #334)

Whale Tip: Fall 2-85, Repairing Stripped Threads for the Cylinder Head Hold Down Studs. Ref. Manual Section 13, Page 12-13.

One of my engines had one of the upper cylinder stud loosen up and pull out. I said, "Gosh darn!" There ought to be a way to put a helicoil in without having to pull the head, cylinders, etc. Of course, the carbs, top shroud, and Crankcase cover must come off. However if it is one of the blind holes you can leave the crankcase cover on, as there won't be any chips, etc, dropping into the crankcase. (With the engine in the car, it takes two people)

First, the drill is easy to make, weld or braze a piece of 3/8" rod to a 25/64" drill so its length is at least 12" long. This goes through the cylinder stud hole through the head, along the cylinder groove in the fins and you drill out the stripped threads in the engine half. (Keep your Home and Shop Vac. running to suck up the drillings. Mark the drill so you will be the correct depth in the blind hole.

Second, the Helicoil 3/8" tap won't go through the 3/8" hole in the head so this tool must be made in two pieces. First I ground the square end to 1/4" to fit in a 1/4" socket extention. The big end of the 1/4" extention had to ground down to fit through the 3/8" hole in the head, and then I cut the extention in half and welded a piece of rod in the middle so that the combined length of the extention and tap is at least 12". To use the tap tool, place the tap up against the drilled hole in the engine half. Insert the round end of the extention and onto the square end of the tap, attach your Tee handle or ratchet wrench to the square end of the extention and carefully cut the threads. Use lots of thread cutting oil. Mark the tap so you will get the right depth. Again, suck up the chips with your vacuum.

Third, the Helicoil installer took a little doing. The one in the helicoil kit is plastic and has a diamond shaped handle that won't turn in the close quarters between the cylinder fins and the engine halves. So I figured this tool would be a breeze. All I had to do was fix a piece of rod to make it 12" long, weld a little handle on it, and go to work. (Little did I know!)

I hauled a junk engine in to practice on.

1. Drilled out stripped threads. All OK (Don't push too hard)

2. Tapped the hole. All OK.

3. Inserted installer tool without coil. Helicoil won't go through hole in head. So insert installer through head and put the coil on after. Put coil on threaded end, and started to screw the coil into the threaded hole, with the coil almost in. Things got tight and the installer jammed up. It distorted the coil, garbled things in general. Tried it in another prepared hole. Same thing.

I compared my tool with the plastic tool and found the plastic threads were cut real deep, much deeper than a regular bolt. I thought maybe a cheap bolt would have deeper threads. None of them did. Then I remembered that some dies have split design to cut deeper threads. Couldn't Find one for 3/8"x16 in our big town. I bought a regular round one and set about to modify it some how or other.


Thought maybe I could break it in two and grind it to cut deeper threads. I thought of, and discarded a dozen other ideas, finally decided maybe a carbide grit rod saw might cut it. The rod cut it, but don't try it unless you have an afternoon to kill. As shown on the drawing, I cut a slot and a notch, when I tightened the holding screw on the die handle, it finally cut the threads deep enough for my installer to work just perfect. Another problem solved.

Fourth, the helicoil. The thickness of the threaded hole in the engine half is just a little over 1/8 of an inch long, not really enough to take the torque required for the cylinder rod. So you have to cut a regular one down to 5 coils. With a little practice on the square edge of a grinding wheel, that can be done. I install the complete helicoil in first, knock out the tang with a 1/4" rod, and then install the partial helicoil up against the full one, and knock out that tang with my 1/4" rod. And that's it.

-13 - 4" CHAIN - WELD TO SIDES OF PLATE AS SHOWN.


