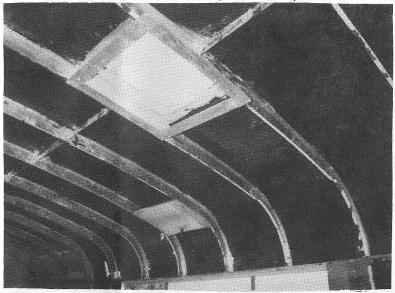

Craig Lamond's #005 Travelon (ULTRA VAN)

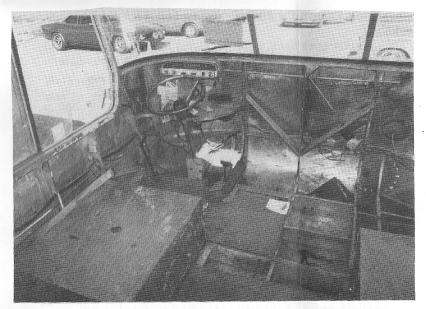
This vehicle goes back to 1963. David Peterson had sold the rights to manufacture **ULTRA Van** to the Presto-Lite Corp. in San Leandro, California. They produced and sold about 5 or 6 of them under the name "Travelon." This was an **ULTRA Van** produced and assembled in San Leandro, California to Mr. Peterson's plans. It was 24 feet long, with integrated water tanks and double wheels in the rear like all the early **ULTRA Vans**.

Craig found this van in Manhattan Beach, California. I had gone to see this van in 1988 will Bill Benney. We both decided it was too far gone to really save. But Craig didn't think so. He had them drag it out of their back yard and towed it home.

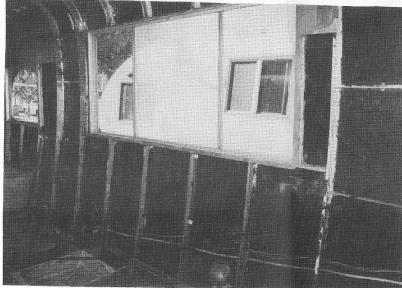

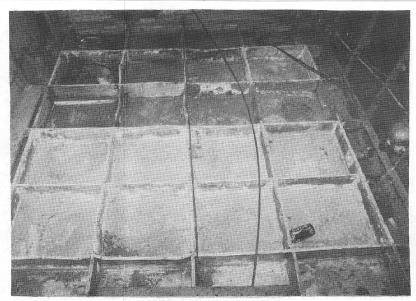
The roof with vent cover missing. The black stuff is undercoating.



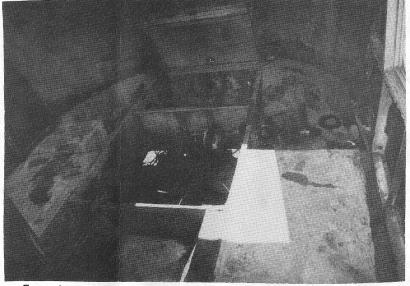
Forward Driving Compartment. Note windshield wiper uses one motor with a shaft to drive the right blade.



Side bay window. Wire harness runs along this side, as with later vans. Note larger rear side window at left.



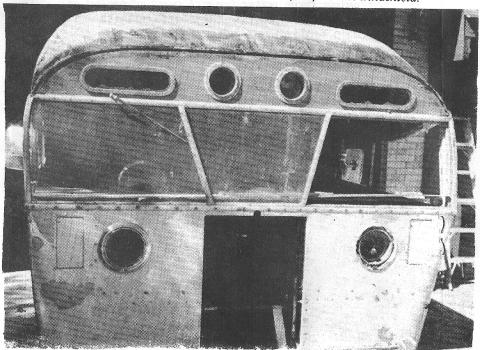

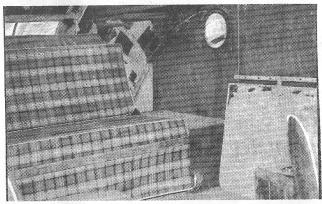

- 1) The Land Yacht is built on a '47 Packard limousine chassis with a 148-inch wheelbase.
- It has the correct 356 cid straight-eight engine and threespeed with overdrive transmission.
- 3) The chassis is totally stock and unmodified. The steering gear and brake and accelerator pedals are in their original positions. The steering wheel is 6½-feet from the windshield.

- 5) The grille is oak.

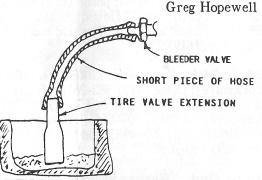
- 6) The Land Yacht is purported to be one of 15-20 units built in either Minnesota or Wisconsin. This one was being used in central Michigan when it "died."

- 8) In addition to the logo on the doors, faintly visible lettering spells out "The Miller Furnace Co. Field Office."

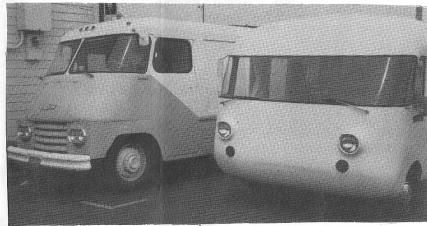

EASY BRAKE BLEEDING

By using a tire valve extender, and a short piece of rubber hose, a brake cylinder can be bled while operating alone. Put the hose over the bleeder port and the tire valve extender as shown below. Open the bleeder port and pump fluid through until the air is out of the system. The Schrader valve acts as a check valve to prevent air reentering the system as the brake pedal is released on each stroke.
