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

Coach Report...by Richard Finch

The first Ultra Van Coach to arrive for the Tularosa Rally was Dave Stoddard in his Coach # 352 that is powered by a 350 cubic inch Chevy V-8 engine with a 350 Hydromatic transmission. Dave bought this coach already converted and he spends several months each year parked at a friend's place near Deming, New Mexico. Dave always travels with his cat, a purebred Russian Blue that is very pretty.

Dave also spends several months each winter at "The Slabs" near the Salton Sea in California.

The second coach to arrive was an Oldsmobile Tornado powered 1972 year model special edition owned by Howard and Marsha Bosso who live in Apache Junction, Arizona, near Phoenix. Their Ultra Van is for sale because they spend most of their time in their newer RV. While they were here at the Rally, a lady called from Denver, Colorado and asked if she could attend the rally to see and maybe buy an Ultra Van. The lady did drive all the way from Denver and the last I heard, she was planning to stop by Apache Junction to buy the Bosso's Ultra Van that Howard had converted to Buick V-6 power.

The next Ultra Van to arrive was the Galli's Corvair powered S/N # 504. Bob has made a large number of improvements to their unit, including adding a queen sized air matress in back and he moved the batteries to ahead of the rear axle to improve the weight distribution.

Bob has also modified the differential housing so he can dip-stick check the differential oil level and add oil if necessary from above rather than having to crawl under the van. One very nice addition is an electronic ignition monitor and control unit. Bob and Diane also have roll-out awnings on both sides of their unit.

The next Ultra Van to arrive was Jim Craig in their special built prototype S/N # 604. Christy Barden wrote a report on this fine unit in a WOW issue last year.

One of the improvements that Jim has made to their # 604 is to mount a satellite TV dish on the rear ladder so that it is easy to set up each time they stop for the night, you can see a picture of the satellite dish in this newsletter

The next Ultra Van to arrive was Hal and Tote Pickering in their S/N # 271. Hal had just returned from a ski trip that took him to many ski areas in New Mexico and Colorado, the last stop being Gunnison, CO. This coach still has the Corvair engine and Powerglide automatic transmission.

The Pickerings also own Ultra Van S/N # 294 which they drove by our house just this past week end. They let me drive it and it seems ready for the road, just like their other one


The next Ultra Van OWNER to arrive was Rich Morrison who lives about 12 miles from Tularosa in La Luz, NM. Rich owns # 202 which is a very, very early coach that has the dual rear tires and swing axle. It has a unique entry door that is behind the kitchen and near the middle of the right side of the coach. A picture of this coach is on page. 4 of this newsletter. Rich met us for lunch on Saturday and left his coach at home inside a Butler building because it has not traveled in several months.

One coincidence about # 202 is that Jim and Marlene Craig owned it several years ago . We hope to see Rich Morrison and his # 202 at CORSA events in the future.

And of course another Ultra Van attended the Rally in Tularosa, namely # 443, the Ultra Van that belongs to Gayle Finch, our Siamese cat and is maintained and driven by your editor, Richard Finch. It is 95 h.p. Corvair powered and is still being restored,

but while it is traveling . It's next trip will be to Kent, WA and to Arlington, WA in July of 2001.

Pete Valentine owns another Ultra Van that he has installed a Buick 3800 V-6 engine and transverse transmission in where the Corvair engine once was. Pete's coach has no cabinets, no kitchen, and no toilet in it. It was used as a clothing display office for many years before Pete and his wife bought it. The Valentines live just 12 miles form Tularosa but they were not able to attend the Rally this year. They are both in their 80's, but quite active.



Accommodations at the Galli's by Bob Galli

We live in Atascadero, CA. which is 17 miles East of the coastal towns of Morro Bay and Cambria, CA and about half-way between San Francisco and Los Angeles on Highway 101. We are about 25 miles inland from the world famous Hearst Castle. We have about 1 3/4 acres of land. This was my Grandmother's home, purchased in 1927. All of our family history is here at this place. (editor's note, Bob and Diane also have a wonderful new two story house built right on the banks of a creek. The second story is living quarters and the ground floor is a very well equipped automotive machine shop. The house reminds me of the house/barns in Switzerland where the family lives upstairs and the barn is downstairs.)

Our Ultra Van parking place is a concrete slab that measures 15" x 35", poured specifically for this purpose with 110 volt power and air pressure plumbed nearby for maintaining our Ultra Van. We poured the slab in 1993 and it is out in the open, not sheltered from the elements. This slab is along side a corrugated tin garage that my Grandmother built in 1940 to house her then- new 1940 Chevrolet. The tin building is now filled to the rafters with Corvair parts, with room down the center to allow me to select the part I need if I can find it. On the other side of the tin building, I have various electrical outlets with various voltages and amperages. This is beside a 40" x 70" parking area which is graveled.

Nearby is the windmill and a good water supply. We do not have a sewage system dump, but we have a hot shower and a bathroom over in Grandmother's house.

If you are in the area you are invited to stop in and visit for whatever length of time. If we are not home, you are welcome to park, hook up and fill with water and stay the night. If you are having mechanical problems, you are welcome to come here to get it fixed. I have jacks, tools and parts to handle almost any mechanical problem, no matter how serious. I have tools and equipment to handle automatic transmissions, differentials engines cylinder heads turning brake drums and etc. If you need to come in "on the heads" or

differentials, engines, cylinder heads, turning brake drums, and etc. If you need to, come in "on the hook" or flatbed, heaven forbid. Call ahead first though. We just had a visit from Dave Stoddard, UV # 352. While Dave was here we replaced both rear axle spindle assemblies on his Ultra Van with rebuilt ones. He should be fixed up for some time now. And we had a very good visit with him.

While you are here, you can watch the herd of deer across the road, and the tree squirrels and the wild turkeys in the afternoons. Stop by and see us.......Bob and Dianne Galli, S/N 504

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
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
