


bed pan placed near the 4 poster bed. The owner teaches auto restoration at a community college.

half-ton pickup found in a field in Kansas. The builder, a restorer from North Carolina, used the cab for a pattern, constructing a new one, larger, to better fit the dimensions of this long wheelbased beauty. Note the "high wheeler," also hand-built.

He knows that I thrive on them. As a youngster I built carts and carts and carts. Concrete dams. Barns. Repaired cars and engines. Then when I turned 18 I built a 1,200 sq. ft. home. So, anyway. I peeked through the filthy window, and I'm a little touched. " What do they want for this egg? ' "\$550.".Dave says. "Naw, I don't think so. Anyway, I'm getting wet." "Dave, we had better head home.

On our way home after leaving Dave's, Barbara says "Where did you go with Dave?"
" He took me to see this motor home, looks like an egg. It's a disaster." But then I'm attracted to disasters, to an overwhelming feeling of making something run again, bring it back to life sort of.

Laying in bed, I can't get the egg out of my mind. So, in the morning I said to Barbara,"Let's go back and take another look." When we arrive, there is a young man in the garage, I said "Do you mind if I look at the motor home." yes, it's OK, but it's been sold!......to be continued!





Since there were no letters to the editor this edition, (at least there were no letters that I could print here), I thought I could fill the space with a story about a cross-country trip with our Ultra Van accompanied by the brand-new GMC Ryder truck pictured above.

The trip was our second of three trips, moving from Santa Barbara, CA to Tularosa, NM. Our friends Barry and Teresa Vincent were driving the Ryder truck through for us, hauling furniture and office equipment to our new home. They wanted to help us move because Barry and I once worked at White Sands Proving Grounds together in the 1960's. Barry and Teresa live in Turlock,

Each time we stopped for gas on the trip, the Ultra Van would get 18 mpg while the 7 liter GMC V-8 would only get 6 mpg. Barry and I were traveling with walkie-talkies and even on level roads, Barry would have to call me and ask me to "slow down". We were trying to maintain 65 mph, but the Ultra Van was always wanting to go faster. On several mountain passes, the Ultra Van was so much faster going up hill that I thought Barry had stopped altogether. But not so, his GMC was just shifted down into 1st gear with its 6 speed Allison automatic transmission. I was pulling the small 2-wheel trailer behind the Ultra Van and Barry was pulling a car dolly with Gayle's '91 Chevy Cavalier Convertible on the car dolly.

On the two day, 20 hour trip, the Ultra Van probably could have arrived 5 or 6 hours ahead of the Ryder truck if we had just driven our best speeds.....(editor)..
