## TECH TIP NUMBER 2010-01

**SUBJECT** Multiplex Wiring for Ultra Vans

### UV MANUAL SECTION 15-01 AUTHOR Jim Davis #388

Simpler, lighter and more reliable wiring system is now available for Ultra Vans. Intelligent Silicon Integrated System (ISIS) markets a complete programmable multiplex wiring. The heart of the system are solid state micro controllers and logic devices. The basic system consist of a master cell, power cells, and controller area network.

The system is envisioned with the master cell located in the dash area. A master cell contains wires to coordinate and control fifty inputs and fifty outputs plus two analog inputs. All master cell inputs and outputs are 22 gauge copper wires since they only carry sense currents of less than one milliampere. The controller area network (CAN) caries the signals from the master cells to the power cells. All signals are multiplexed on the CAN so only four small wires are needed to interconnect the cells. The CAN can be collocated with any other wiring with the exception of the ignition's secondary wires spark plug wires). The master cell contains a LCD screen which can be used in trouble shooting to verify any operation. The system operates at 5.5 volts so a low battery power condition will not disable the system. Master cells can pulse over a thousand a second allowing pulse width modulation to motors (variable speed) and variable intensity lighting.

The power cell contains 10 fused outputs each rated for 25 amps. If a higher amperage is needed, an external relay can me added to the circuit using the power cell to control the relay. The input to the power cell is a meg-fused 8 gauge wire from the battery or other stable power source. Each power cell can handle a maximum of 125 amps continuously. Each power cell circuit is individually fused with a dual brightness fuse. If the fuse light is bright the circuit is in use, if it is off, the system is de-energized and if the fuse light is dim there is a break in the circuit (bad bulb, broken wire, cold soldered connection, etc.). There is a LED located on each power cell to verify the CAN is operation properly. All connections to the power cell are waterproof and explosion proof allowing it to be mounted anywhere.

Power cells should be located near their use point: center front of coach, and trunk/engine area (max temperature is 290 F). The fused output side harness of the power cell comes pre-terminated at one end with the industry standard Delphi Metri-Pack 280 sealed connectors. The heavy wiring (14 gauge) goes only from the power cell to each accessory. For example let's consider the tail/stop lights. Sense from the turn signal switch and/or the brake light switch goes to the master cell. The master cell transmits that information to the rear power cell over the CAN. The power cell operates the turn signal element as programmed (standard is 1/2 second on and 1/2 second off) for 20 seconds, then stops the sequence whether the turn signal switch is in the turn or off position. Should the turn signal switch be moved into the other turn direction, the previous sequence is stopped and the proper sequence is started. The sequence may be re-imitated by moving the turn signal switch to off and back to turn. If the brakes are applied before the start of the turn both brake lights will illuminate and when the turn signal switch is moved, the proper sequence for that turn will override the previous stop light instruction. Should the turn signal sequence be initialed before the brake signal, the brake light signal will not interrupt the turn signal. You can now get rid of the flashers, multiple wires heavy gauge wires to the switches, interconnected relays. The front power cell can power: the headlights (high/ low beam and daytime running lights), windshield wipers (multiple speed, independently controlled), turn signals, parking lights, clearance lights, identification lights, defroster fans (infinite speed control) and front interior lights. Did I mention remote control? How about approaching the coach at night and having the interior lights come on by remote and 90 seconds after the coach is started, dim gradually.

The rear power cell would operate the starter, engine ignition, electric fuel pumps, tail/stop lights, backup lights, rear clearance lights, rear identification lights, and cooling fans for the transmission cooler and engine oil cooler.

The system is E-PROM controlled so if battery power is lost the programming remains. Although the system comes preprogrammed with a standard operating program, a system programmer is available or ISIS can reprogram a master cell for special operations. A security, anti-theft system is built into the master cell and is operated by the 16 function remote.

Now for the bad news: the starter kit of one master cell, two power cells, CAN cable, main power input cables, 50 ring and 50 blade connectors, main power fuses, and wiring instructions is \$999.00. Additional power cells and master cells are available separately. Up to three master cell can be interconnected and a single master cell can control five power cells.
