There have been questions regarding the procedures and selection of a person who should receive the Ernest Newhouse Award. The following was taken from our By-Laws Dated 2006 Appendix – J Paragraph 2 Procedures (5/93)(7/00)(8/05)

The award recognizes an Ultra Member who has contributed in an outstanding manner to the progress, enjoyment and general success of the Club and its activities, and meets the qualifications as stated in "B" below. (7/00)(8/05) Basis for selection will be the individual performance during the entire period of membership. Not limited to the previous year or any other shorter time period. To qualify for nomination of this award, the individual must have done four of the following six items:

- 1. Host at least one National Rally.
- 2 .Hold a Chair position of a committee.
- 3. Hold at least one term as a club officer, Tech. or other Club position.
- 4. Be a member of the Club for a minimum of two years.
- 5. Host at least two regional Rallies, or a second National Rally.
- 6. Accomplish outstanding or superior services to the Club.

A written, qualifying report will be sent to the President for each nominee for verification. The President will forward each qualified report to the editor for inclusion on the Ballot.

Members vote by ballot, preceding or during the National Rally. Nominations will be as specified in paragraph 2B above.

Presentation of the award occurs at the National Rally. A tie vote selects the individual of longest Club membership. An individual may receive the award one time. The "Ernie Award" is the highest individual recognition that the Club offers. The Medallion will be worn at all Ultra Assemblies

WESTERN ULTRAVAN RALLY 2014

July 2014 seems far in the future; however with the National CORSA Convention in Tacoma at that time it seems appropriate to accommodate those who want to attend both events. Thus, we have selected a really nice RV Park on Whidbey Island at Deception Pass, July 17-21. It is clean, full hook-ups, great free club-house, nice shower/restrooms, only \$29.89, green grass and a great covered BQ area. There are two log cabins (each sleeps 4 w/bedroom) with all amenities, next to the clubhouse, if you decide not to bring your UV. The park is dog friendly, with miles of walking trails. Although, Whidbey is an island you need not take a ferry. Take Hwy20 off I-5. If you want to spend more money and risk a few bumps you can take the Mukilteo-Clinton Ferry but it will probably take about the same amount of time.

There is much to be seen in this beautiful corner of the US. The park is across the road from Deception Pass State Park, Washington's most popular. Cross the road to Cranberry Lake and beyond that is the bay. There is a corner grocery store and a mile down the road is a small marina where we can take a boat ride. Oak Harbor and the military commissary (for those eligible) are very close. There is a free public transit bus stopping on the corner going to Oak Harbor and beyond. We are planning a "cruise" (ferry ride) to San Juan Island.

Since those going to the CORSA Convention will have a few days in the Tacoma area, we thought we should offer something at a different location, only two hours from the LeMay Museum. After the UV Rally, if you are taking your UV to the CORSA convention you might want to make reservations at the Majestic RV Park, only ten minutes from the museum or RSVP at the MURANO Hotel in Tacoma.



ULTRAVAN WEEK RALLY IN MOUNTAIN VIEW by Gary Anderson

(Author's note: There were no other volunteers to write this. Be happy it wasn't you.)

Monday: Our trip to the Mountain View Rally got under way a full day late, but still with adequate time if we kept a tight schedule. After a 27-mile shortcut over winding and hilly secondary roads, one of us, whom shall remain nameless, discovered she had left her medications at home. (OK. Self restraint. Count to 10. No cursing.) Disconnected the popup camper from the car (don't ask where #420 is) & drove back home for the meds. At that point one of us (again, nameless) discovered that he didn't have the house key on the key ring. Oops! There went the moral high ground. After some delay in retrieving a key from the neighbor, we got the meds and started again. Long day. Minnesota (twice). Iowa. Part of Missouri. Eat in car. Spill on pants. Quit at dark.

Afternoon devoted to getting supplies, making pies, and more visiting. Evening pot luck dinner in the Pickin' Shed. (Relieved to find that the Pickin' Shed is for stringed instruments, not noses.) Got to meet everybody that we hadn't met before. Got stuffed with excellent stuff, but no wine. Dry county; dryer campground. Wouldn't you know it? Wound up with a pair of wine glasses at the Yankee swap after dinner. In a dry county, could possession of wine glasses be the legal equivalent of possession of drug paraphernalia? Decided not to find out. Stashed 'em in the camper. High point of the evening was a top-heavy Nancy Pratt in a blonde wig, lip-synching Patsy Cline's "I've got

The system is simple, cheap to build, and readily crafted by most UV owners. What more could

you want? He promises a Tech Tip will be forthcoming. From there, the session devolved into the exchange of the waste product of male cattle. (No Tech Tips necessary.) Afternoon spent wondering the grounds of the Folk Center, listening to live music and visiting handcrafters' shops. Most everyone attended the evening music show at the Folk Center auditorium. Friday: Up at 5 to make caramel rolls for morning coffee & goodies. Rainy day, but a break from the heat. More of that good coach hopping in the morning. Larry needed gaskets for his carburetor screws and Terry needed vittles. I was disappointed to learn that the hardware store where I had purchased wooden handles for a walking plow about twenty years ago no longer stocks them. Things are getting modern around here. Those who were up for two days of folk music in a row went to Arkansas State Fiddling Championships at the Folk Center. By all accounts they had a great time. We took the opportunity to go to bed early.

Saturday: THE BIG DAY. Morning coffee & goodies. Gorgeous weather. Sunny, cooler, less humidity. We learned that Glenn Lemke spent a few days under observation in the hospital, but is fine, so a collective sigh of relief. Silent auction winners paid up and collected their UV/Corvair parts. Larry Forman got the turn signal unit he needed, I got some gauges and a gasket, and Jerry Kramer got some valve cover gaskets. The previous owners got some storage space, a little cash, and the knowledge that the parts would be useful to the new owners. Following the board of directors meeting, and UVMCC East & West division meetings, there was a general membership meeting (details found elsewhere in the WOW). The Bozos left after the meetings. Done before noon, with the rest of the afternoon free to visit, go downtown, up to the folk center, or stay home and prepare to depart. In late afternoon we were taken by coach to the Skillet Restaurant at the Folk Center for the banquet buffet. The Skillet offers regional foods like fried chicken, fried potatoes, fried okra, fried hush puppies, fried pie, fried green salad....... (Well, maybe not fried salad.) It was all very good. Honest. And then there was dessert - even better. During the sugar high, Roy Davis was honored with the UVMCC's highest honor, the Earnest Newhouse award for sustained outstanding service to the club. Let's hear it for Roy! That was followed by presentation of the CORSA award for best chapter newsletter, awarded to our editor, Brenda Standal. The award had been announced at the CORSA convention in July, but was kept a secret from Brenda. Absolute firstrate job, Brenda. TECH TIP NUMBER: 2013-01 SUBJECT: Parking Brake Modification UV MANUAL SECTION: 11-21



My petite wife has always had trouble pulling up on the parking brake handle enough to keep the coach from rolling. Rather than redesigning the whole thing, there had to be a better way to increase the pull on the brake cable without modifying the handle and cable assembly. We have an Ultra Light airport across the road so, one day I was helping string a new control cable when the idea came to me.

Using some scrap 0.80" thick aluminum made a carrier for three 1.25" poly plastic control cable pulleys purchased from Wicks Aircraft Supply. On the closed end of the carrier, I mounted one pulley on a #10-32 machine screw. In the center, I stacked two pulleys with a couple steel #10 washers separating them on another #10-12 machine screw. At the open end of the carrier, I used the original 1.5" pulley.

A 16" long piece of 1/4" cable was threaded through the rear 1.5" pulley and attached to the brake cable, connecting the rear brakes, using cable clamps. There is where the adjustment is critical. You should have just enough slack so the brakes don't drag. Remember, the brake handle will now move about twice the distance it did before to set the brakes, but you will have twice the pressure on the brake shoes.

Threading for the cable from the brake handle is as follows: Cable first goes around the lower pulley of the stack of two (middle of three pulleys shown), then around the end single pulley (closest to the front), next around the top middle pulley and finally to the cable anchor on the coach. The back pulley is not necessary but retained incase adjustments were necessary. The cable is wound around the pulleys clockwise when viewed from the bottom.
