"The Ernest Newhouse Award"

There have been questions regarding the procedures and selection of a person who should receive the Ernest Newhouse Award. The following was taken from our By-Laws Dated 2006 Appendix - J Paragraph 2 Procedures (5/93)(7/00)(8/05)

The award recognizes an Ultra Member who has contributed in an outstanding manner to the progress, enjoyment and general success of the Club and its activities, and meets the qualifications as stated in "B" below. (7/00)(8/05) Basis for selection will be the individual performance during the entire period of membership. Not limited to the previous year or any other shorter time period. To qualify for nomination of this award, the individual must have done four of the following six items:

- 1. Host at least one National Rally.
- 2 .Hold a Chair position of a committee.
- 3. Hold at least one term as a club officer, Tech. or other Club position.
- 4. Be a member of the Club for a minimum of two years.
- 5. Host at least two regional Rallies, or a second National Rally.
- 6. Accomplish outstanding or superior services to the Club.

A written, qualifying report will be sent to the President for each nominee for verification. The President will forward each qualified report to the editor for inclusion on the Ballot.

Members vote by ballot, preceding or during the National Rally. Nominations will be as specified in paragraph 2B above.

Presentation of the award occurs at the National Rally. A tie vote selects the individual of longest Club membership. An individual may receive the award one time. The "Ernie Award" is the highest individual recognition that the Club offers. The Medallion will be worn at all Ultra Assemblies

ULTRA VAN ADVENTURES by Jerry and Patty Mello

On our way back home from the National Rally in Tombstone we were having a wonderful time site seeing our way through southern Utah and had worked our way into California. The Ultra Van was running great, even going up 14 percent grades on hwy12 between Capitol Reef National Park and Bryce Canyon National Park. This is an extremely beautiful drive with thrilling views, but I don't think I'll drive a Corvair powered Ultra Van on it anytime soon. We were in southern California heading towards the San Francisco Bay Area to visit relatives when things took a very bad turn for the worse. We were on hwy58, heading towards Bakersfield coming down a long grade out of Tehachapi. back into the throttle things did not sound right. Patty and I looked at each other and Patty said, "That doesn't sound right". We pulled off at the next exit and into a gravel lot. A guick inspection told me that I did not want to go any further. Oil was dripping from the main seal and there was loud knocking emanating from the center of the block. After a 3 hour wait, our tow truck arrived and hauled us 30 miles to the Orange Grove RV Park where we spent the night. I had called my brother who owns an Auto Body Shop in Fremont California. When we made our first cross country trip in 2009 with our then just mechanically refurbished Ultra Van, he said he would be expecting my call to come rescue us when we broke down. After seven years the call was finally made. He quickly volunteered to drive his tow truck down to retrieve us. The next morning when we positioned his roll back for pulling the Ultra Van onto it, we noticed that his light duty truck was too narrow. I quickly came up with the idea of using space saver spare tires on the front to narrow the front. All we had to do was make a quick trip to a local wrecking yard and pick up a couple. Three hours and 12 yards later we found two that would work from mid 90s Chevy Astro vans. With my wallet \$80 lighter we were guickly loaded and on our way. Because my brother's truck would only seat two, he carried a car for us to drive back to his place. Patty was sure the Ultra Van was destined to fall off the rollback with every bump in the road. We made it to my brother's place in the San Jose foothills Milpitas

We sleep in the Ultra Van that night because we are more comfortable with our own mattress and after all it is our home away from home. A quick inspection the next morning revealed that I could turn the torque converter about 1" before any resistance. After 40.500 miles in the motor home, the crankshaft had broken!!!! Everything I needed to build a replacement engine was only 600 miles north in my shop. My brother loaned us one of his pickups so I dropped the drive train out, onto a pallet and into the pickup. On the trip from San Jose to Albany Oregon, I discovered that my Ultra Van uses less fuel than a 2003 Ford F250. When I got home I spent 14 hours a day assembling a new engine. hurry to get my brother's truck back to him and get the Ultra Van out of his backyard. On hind sight this was NOT a good plan! I always test run engines before installing them. Over the years I have come to hate points! When vehicles are new they aren't too bad. The points needed to be adjusted periodically and replaced every now and then. With age they can be a real pain! I have seen problems with three other Ultra Vans using points in recent years. The points cams get rougher with age and wear the pad on the points changing the dwell and the timing. For the initial firing I use point because it is easier to get the timing set and then I switch over to a pertronix. With the points installed the engine would not fire. No spark. I cleaned the points, changed points, cleaned all connections, changed the coil, no luck. After a good night's rest, I pulled out the points plate and put the pertronix from my pickup and it started right away. Hooray. But what is that noise? Just as I was about to stop the engine, it came to an abrupt stop! Now what? With tears in my eyes I went into the house to tell Patty that my plans to drive the new engine back to San Jose had been postponed. I gathered my composure and went out to the shop to conduct an autopsy. In my exhausted state I neglected to torque the rod bolts on 1, 3 and 5. I still can't believe I did that! I guess that's why I run all my engines before I put them into a vehicle. New plan. Take my time and make sure everything is done correctly. My blunder had caused more damage than a broken crankshaft! Let's see, another block, crankshaft, 3 sets of rods, pistons and cylinders. Carefully inspect any reused parts and double check everything. Success, the Ultra Van with a rebuilt engine is now snug in its place in the shop where it belongs. Another lesson learned the hard way.
