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"The Ernest Newhouse Award"

There have been questions regarding the procedures and selection of a person who should receive the Ernest Newhouse Award. The following was taken from our By-Laws Dated 2006 Appendix – J Paragraph 2 Procedures (5/93)(7/00)(8/05)

The award recognizes an Ultra Member who has contributed in an outstanding manner to the progress, enjoyment and general success of the Club and its activities, and meets the qualifications as stated in "B" below. (7/00)(8/05) Basis for selection will be the individual performance during the entire period of membership. Not limited to the previous year or any other shorter time period. To qualify for nomination of this award, the individual must have done four of the following six items:

- 1. Host at least one National Rally.
- 2 .Hold a Chair position of a committee.
- 3. Hold at least one term as a club officer, Tech. or other Club position.
- 4. Be a member of the Club for a minimum of two years.
- 5. Host at least two regional Rallies, or a second National Rally.
- 6. Accomplish outstanding or superior services to the Club.

A written, qualifying report will be sent to the President for each nominee for verification. The President will forward each qualified report to the editor for inclusion on the Ballot.

Members vote by ballot, preceding or during the National Rally. Nominations will be as specified in paragraph 2B above.

Presentation of the award occurs at the National Rally. A tie vote selects the individual of longest Club membership. An individual may receive the award one time. The "Ernie Award" is the highest individual recognition that the Club offers. The Medallion will be worn at all Ultra Assemblies

SUNDAY 7 MAY ------ Leave Kingman early morning – parade up the winding roads through Oatman to Topock for the Award Ceremony (70 miles).

The Route 66 Fun Run is a popular annual event, the first weekend of May, attracting 800-plus classic cars, some even from over-seas – for a 140-mile "parade" from Seligman to Topock Az, on the longest continuous stretch of the famous historic Highway, Route 66 – the Mother Road.

The parade starts on Saturday 6 May, 10 am, from SELIGMAN, famous for its Snow Cap Drive in.

The small communities along Route 66 on the 70 miles to Kingman, enthusiastically greet paraders with many entertainment choices:

PEACH SPRINGS (the Hualapai Nation's Tribal Capital) puts on a great BBQ and colorful cultural dancing and Indian craft vendors.

GRAND CANYON CAVERNS is the largest dry caverns in the United States. Its elevator descends 230 feet, offering reasonably priced easy-walking tours. It also has a motel, diner, gift shop and RV Park, in addition to its local ghost resident.

HACKBERRY, the oldest town on our Route 66, greets paraders with its famous 1957 cherry red Corvette Convertible and a live country/rock band, food vendors and gift shop.

VALLE VISTA, a Route 66 golf course community, welcomes paraders to its BBQ.

By Saturday mid-afternoon, paraders will have driven under the Welcome Arch in Downtown

KINGMAN, for the SHOW-N-SHINE. Judges and spectators will busy themselves admiring all the beautiful classics on display, filling up street after street after street. Imagine the sight of our Ultra Vans proudly on display being swarmed with curious people!

On Sunday morning, 7 May, the Fun Run parade leaves Kingman, up the winding roads in the Black Mountains to the famous mining town of OATMAN, with its wild free-roaming burros and handsome gun fighters, wood-plank sidewalks, quaint restaurants and gift shops.

Then down through the beauty and desolation of our desert into TOPOCK, on the Colorado River at the California border – the official end of the Route 66 Fun Run, where the trophies are awarded to lucky Fun Run participants.

Any street-legal vehicle is welcomed in the Fun Run, even if it isn't a classic. It's not necessary to register and purchase the Fun Run's packet for \$55 just to drive in the Fun Run...it's a public highway. But to display your vehicle in the Show-n-Shine and to receive the special License

Plate, Goodie Bag and hopeful Award, you must register. There'll be room in our Ultras and buses to bring you along for the Fun Run ride if you'd rather not drive your own vehicle

TECH ARTICLE NUMBER: 2017-01 UV MANUAL SECTION: 01-05

SUBJECT: Fix Cracks Under Ultra Door AUTHOR: Jerry Kramer #424

I've been asked to explain my fix for the cracks under the door of the Ultra. I have done two fixes. The front was by far the easier and involved the outside only. About 10 years ago, I noticed a 2 ½ inch crack below the front edge of the door. This seems to be a weak point in the design. I used a 10 x 4 ½ inch piece of 3003 x .040 soft aluminum which I formed to fit over the crack. The soft aluminum allows it to be formed until it fits closely to the shape of the panel you are covering. I didn't remove any paint, but your patch is only as good as what it is attached to, so be sure your paint has good adhesion. I sanded and cleaned both pieces before attaching. Drilling a rivet hole in each corner is an easy way to hold it in place while the epoxy cures. I applied epoxy to both sides, moved the piece around slightly to spread the glue, then use nails to locate the holes before riveting. A soft aluminum rivet in each corner is all that is needed because it is only to hold the patch in place while the epoxy with a long enough cure time to allow you to coat both sides and get the patch firmly in place before it starts to set up. Cool temperatures will help.

I understand that body shops are bonding panels in place instead of welding. You might look into what they are using as this might be even better than ordinary epoxy.

The rear involved removing the fuel tank and would be too much for a tech tip. If anyone has questions, feel free to call me at 419-852-5720.

Our second event was the middle of February in Pensacola, FL, the Corvair Lover's Holiday. A couple of fun days with our Corvair friends. Beautiful weather. Turkel got one of top three Specialty awards and Chris won the grand door prize, a new TV. No, it's not going in Turkel, we like to live period correct, so just the lava lamp for entertainment.
