I've jumped into the deep water one more time buying the last production Ultra Van number 605. It was not completed by Dave Peterson. It left the factory as the aluminum shell only. It was made into a "driver" by George Truman, but never driven on the road. Jim Craig purchased 605 back in 1995 and re-sold it to Roy Muranaka. Roy left it in Jim's backyard in Joshua Tree where it stayed until, with the help of two friends, it was towed to my shop in Albany, Oregon. My friend George volunteered himself and his GMC crew cab diesel as the tow rig. Fellow UV'er Carl Jones, who is partially responsible for the purchase of 605 was gently coerced into coming along. Carl was of great assistance in making 605 safe to flat tow the 1000 miles to my place. We only had a couple of issues on the way home, the first was the front wheels did not want to return to straight ahead after a left turn. That was corrected by adjusting the caster on the front suspension. The second problem was discovered at the last rest stop on I-5 in northern California. We had stopped for a break and I looked at the front tire on 605 and asked out loud," I wonder how much tread we scrubbed off the front tires?" Carl and I decided we should check. The driver's side looked good as well as the two rear. The passenger side front was another matter. On the inside edge of the tire cord was showing. Then I remembered, one of the tire and wheel sets that I borrowed from Carl was a trailer tire. I had planned on putting that on the rear. I had completely forgotten about it until that moment. Yes, the worn tire was in fact the trailer tire. Expecting tire problems, I had brought two spare tires. We quickly put the spare on and motored down the road. With the non-trailer tire on the front, the steering responded much quicker. Yes, there is a reason why they print on the sidewall "for trailer use only"!

I've got big plans for 605, I hope I am able to complete them. It took me almost 10 years to complete 333. I learned a lot during the rebuilding of 333 that I can apply to 605. Patty has told me that 605 will be done by December of 2021 for our new year's trip to the Oregon coast.


of those like a break down in Willets, a holiday weekend where everything was closed. Larry was impressed with my "throw it together" full meal.



Pantry essentials

Spice mixes: Rather than packing loads of individual spices, choose from a few versatile combinations. Taco Seasoning, Italian Seasoning, and Pumpkin Pie Spice are some great options.

Canned goods: Reduce cooking time and improve storage by stocking up on canned beans, tomatoes, and fruit. Cans are cheap and easy to stack—just remember to pack a can opener.



Dry goods: Be sure to pack staple foods such as rice, pasta, dried fruits, oats, and nuts, especially if you're planning to cook your own dishes.

Snacks: Try to find healthy, non-perishable snacks like trail mix or beef jerky. It helps to have something you can throw in your backpack for a hike or day at the beach.

Baking mixes: Instead of filling your cupboards with flour, baking soda, sugar, and other baking essentials, use pre-made flour blends. You might be surprised by how much you can make with a box of pancake mix.

Microwave oven: Though it can take up a lot of your precious counter or cupboard space, a microwave oven offers more convenience than any other cooking method, as it can quickly cook or reheat almost any food.

Aluminum foil: Never underestimate the power of good old aluminum foil. Whether cooking on the stove, in the oven, or over the fire, foil is often a necessity.
