



BED PLATFORM LIFT MECHANISM

by Larry Forman

Today I FINALLY was able to get the bed platform lowered with a mattress lift mechanism working with the mattress in

place. While I still have a lot to do to finish this project, it has been a long road of several years to lower the platform including the two rear radiators and plumbing lines, a low profile air cleaner and cold air intake system, all the electrical and air lines and the bed platform supporting structure. Rosie wanted it lowered as much as possible and I was successful in lowering it a full three inches (from 23 inches to 20 inches, whereas the stock Corvair bed platform is 18 inches AFAIK (as far as I know).







I was able to modify Jerry Mello's lift mechanism system to lift the rear part and tip the middle of the mattress, so it is lower. This allows the front part to lift up away

from the closet and bathroom rear walls. The mattress rear part moves forward similar to Jerry's design. This design was unlike Jerry's since his queen -sized mattress was oriented cross-Our queen-sized mattress is oriwise. ented lengthwise from front to back. This meant that the front needed to first tip away from those rear facing



walls and to allow the middle and rear to lift and move forward. The foam mattress is easily able to fold and make all this possible.



I used 10mm (just under 1/2") Alumacorr panels for the mattress lift base instead of 3/8" plywood for weight savings. This is the same material I used to replace the plywood flooring in UV 545. 3/8" plywood weighs about 1 to 1.4 lbs./sq. ft. whereas the 10mm Alumacorr weighs 0.69 lbs./ sq. ft. I had considered using thinner Aluma-

corr at only 5 mm but was concerned if it would be stiff enough. It turns out the thinner material weighs negligibly less at 0.63 lbs./ sq. ft versus the thicker material at 0.69 lbs./ sq. ft. So, there is really no good reason to use the thinner and flimsier material.



The two rear gas lift cylinders were the same is Jerry's at 100 lbs./strut and 20" extended. I happened to have a spare gas lift cylinder for the front at 55 lbs. lift and 25 1/4" extended length, which was just perfect for my application. I was able to use just one for the front part.

Now I need to install two sub-panels under the center lift mechanism to cover the engine and rear structure when the mattress is lifted. Since these


