Ernest Newhouse Award

Each year the Ernest Newhouse Award has the opportunity of being presented. It is important that you read the criteria below for the award and even MORE important you read about submitting a nomination. Please read everything below **CAREFULLY!**



The award recognizes an Ultra Member who has contributed in an outstanding manner to the progress, enjoyment, and general success of The Club and its activities, and meets the qualifications as stated below. Basis for selection will be the individual's performance during the <u>entire</u> period of membership; not just limited to the previous year or any other shorter time period.

To qualify for nomination of this award, the individual must have done <u>four</u> of the following six items:

- 1. Host at least one National Rally
- 2 .Hold a chair position of a committee
- 3. Hold at least one term as a club officer, tech, or other club position
- 4. Be a member of The Club for a minimum of two years
- 5. Host at least two regional rallies, or a second National Rally
- 6. Accomplish outstanding or superior services to The Club

A <u>written, qualifying report</u> (not just their name) must be reviewed by the President for each nominee for verification before the ballot is published on April 1 (**NO** write-ins). The President will forward each qualified report to the newsletter editor for inclusion on the Ballot. Members vote by ballot, preceding or during the National Rally. Presentation of the award occurs at the National Rally. A tie vote selects the individual with the longest Club membership. An individual may receive the award only one time (see your Roster for past recipients)

Again, don't assume someone else will do it. Please send by April 1, 2023.

Turkel has had some work done (mostly wiring for the new instrumentation shown here), but has moved back to the Turkel house with the coming of Michigan winter weather. Chris has created a nice custom dash to incorporate all necessary gauges except the vacuum gauge. The existing vacuum gauge has had LED lighting added. Work on the differential rebuild is

progressing between his unheated workshop and the nice warm laundry room where the top of the dryer has become his workbench.



Part 1 - I found a mechanic who was willing to come to my house to work on my



newly acquired UV #514. This month we got the engine running (#514 is a V8), checked the brakes and repacked the wheel bearings. I took it out for a test drive in my neighborhood and it ran well. Having said that, the next set of problems to deal with are: replacing the Powerglide shifter cable, deciding on what seats to install, flushing out radiator, changing out belts and hoses, and that the tires rub the wheel wells in the front when making hard turns (I don't know yet if I need to change the wheels to 14" instead of 15" and buy new tires). The good news is that the mechanic and I have concluded that the Ultra Van has never been driven many miles as most parts look good, the lights work, etc.

Part 2 - I am looking into what seats to buy. I would like to avoid having to move the steering wheel up for legroom under the new seats. I am ordering a new shifter cable. Thanks for the <u>link</u>. I will be figuring out if there is a smaller tire that I can use on my 15" wheels. They rub on the front only, just a little when fully turning the steering wheel. There are some other issues that I will write about in future months. Thanks.

UV 389 ULTRA ADVENTURE

Whales on Wheels

Gloria and I planned our last Ultra Van trip of the 2022 season for a 10-day drive to Florida from Brownsburg, IN to provide encouragement to some of our family and friends who were involved with hurricane Ian. Some of our friends lost every-thing and some (Gloria's sister) fared much better in Cape Coral. We departed on Friday 10-22-22 as excited, packed and prepared as could be. Unfortunately, what we got was a ride back home with the wrecker and the 389 in tow on the second day due to a valve seat in cylinder #5 that decided to pop out. Our coach has 175,000 miles and is on the 3rd engine as far as I know. This particular 110-hp engine has about 50,000 on it and was as strong and smooth as anything and only used about a quart of oil per 1,000 miles.

Our first and only night on the road was spent at Jellico, TN at the Indian Springs State Park just off I-75 South about 360 miles from home. We had a great visit as usual with several curious campers and always seem to learn more about solar power and lithium iron phosphate batteries, etc. from others much more knowledgeable than I. We recently purchased a Bodega 12/120 volt cooler and have been running it off our 110-volt inverter along with our original Dometic refrigerator which seems to work well. Gloria likes to prepare almost all our meals, so we were well stocked. The factory refrigerator seems to work much better on 110 volts than on propane.

It was a cool night and we vowed to use the electric blanket from now on. I could see steam from the exhaust as the engine warmed up and we left that morning. Within 10 minutes or so we were through the small town of Jellico and on I-75 south headed directly up towards Rarity Mountain when we heard the "backfire/hiccup" sound that even from the front seat of an Ultra Van is unmistakably a bad sound. I noticed the jumping vacuum gage and knew we would need to stop asap. Unbelievably the Lord provided an area that was flat, level, and about <u>1 acre</u> where the highway department had stored millings from asphalt repair. It was a perfect area to get off the interstate and allow the tow truck plenty of room to navigate and connect his wheel lift to the rear of our coach. We were more than halfway to the top of the mountain. It was a perfect day weather-wise and the view from the top of the asphalt millings pile was full of fall color as we waited for the AAA driver. Gloria is like a lot of good wives who think their husbands can fix anything and when I explained what I thought the problem was she asked if I had an extra valve seat in my tool bag. While I appreciated her confidence, I certainly am not Paul Piche, the previous owner, who might well have lowered the engine, taken the head off, found a repair shop and gone on his way. I think Paul <u>actually did</u> this behind a gas station out west.

Our position along the interstate was on a curve and I am sure we looked like a giant billboard of some kind as people drove by. We did have one fellow, Larry, who stopped just because he had once owned Ultra Van #503 and wanted to chat. He purchased his at a garage sale and sold it to a person (member Ken Mitchell) in California soon after.



AAA asked for photos before they would contact a towing company. We do have RV+ on our coverage. Cell reception was spotty, but we were able to text a few pictures and told them the weight and size. Soon after the towing company called for more pictures and said they looked Ultra Vans up on the net and they took the job

as a challenge. I asked for a medium duty flatbed, but the driver wisely brought a large truck that could reach the 6.5 feet to our rear tires from the trailer hitch with a wheel lift and drove back to Indi-

ana at 70 mph with the front wheels on the ground and no damage to our coach.

We listened to stories about how the driver had been hit by cars while working on the roadside and has a total of 64 broken bones in his 18 years of towing. Most drivers did not stop when they hit him. Thirty hours from the time we left home we were back home with the 389 in the barn. PTL. I have not accessed the engine damage yet but hope to be back on the road in the spring.

It was an interesting two days and disappointing of course, but none the less an adventure. One totally unrelated thing that I will never forget was driving down the interstate in Kentucky and being passed by a very young couple sitting side by

side in a 70's Ford pick-up with a paper plate. It reminded me of Gloria and I some 55 years ago and why I still like living a little on the edge and carefree sometimes. At that age and stage of life many of us think it is a great time to go on an adventure with your cars and hobbies whatever they are.

Lew was born and raised in Canton, Ohio. He has an older sister, Donna Bolton, and a younger brother, Ronald Young. Donna traveled to many UVMCC campouts with Lew and Shelley for many years.

Lew joined Central Valley Corvairs in 1993 in hope of finding an Ultra Van. He joined just in time to help with the National Corvair Convention in San Jose the same year.

The very first Ultra Van convention he attended; he was elected President. Served from 2004 - 2007. He oversaw the combining of Group Ultra Van and Ultra Van Motor Coach Club into one club, keeping the name of newsletter "WOW" from Group Ultra Van. In 2007, he was awarded the Ernie Award.

Lew served in the Army as a helicopter pilot, retiring after 20 years as a Major. He served two tours in Vietnam and one year in Korea along with many other assignments that took him all over the world. He then went to work for Westinghouse Corporation, Marine Division – later purchased by Northrop Grumman as a mid-level manager. Retiring, again, in 2001.

He received his under graduate degree from the University of Nebraska at Omaha, Nebraska through the military Boot Strap program and an MBA from Adelphi University, New York State.

After his second retirement, he enjoyed RV travels, working on his many Corvairs and his Ultra Van.

Lew is survived by Shelley, his wife of 57+ years, four daughters and five granddaughters. His much-loved dog, Bandit, was able to visit him just before he passed.

Services will be held January 8, 2023, at P.L. Fry and Sons Funeral Home in Manteca, CA. Burial will be on January 9, 2023, at San Joaquin National Cemetery in Santa Nella, CA.

Your editor met Lew and his wife, Shelley, at the 2015 National Rally in Branson, MO. He is a huge loss to the club.

We're saddened to announce Lewis W. Young, lifelong adventurer, eternal tinkerer, and perhaps the true originator of the "dad joke," passed away in Modesto on December 11, 2022.

Born March 3, 1941 to the late Gayle A. and Lewis J. Young in Canton, Ohio, he spent his childhood with his older sister Donna Bolton, now of Wilton, CA, and younger brother Ron Young, now of Painesville, Ohio.

A dedicated husband, father and grandfather, Lew was surrounded by girls. He leaves behind his beloved Shelley of Manteca, happily married 57 years, and their daughters Elaine Paniewski (Slavek Paniewski), Emma Young (John Emmert), Elizabeth Young (Jeff Prather), and Emily Brandt (Scott Brandt). Four daughters weren't enough, so they went on to have five granddaughters: Ava and Sarah Brandt, Abigail and Anne Prather, and Evelyn Emmert.

Lew maintained, "Every child should have a dog" and he always had a faithful canine companion by his side, including Bandit, whom Lew adopted by the waves in Pismo Beach and who survives him. Sneaking Bandit some bacon and bringing him back leftovers from restaurants was a favorite secret pastime for Lew.

Lew was a gifted mechanic and mathematician and could "MacGyver" or repair about any invention you needed. These talents served him well throughout multiple career paths. He served an apprenticeship for 4 ½ years, followed by Maintenance Supervisor from 1962-1966, at Firestone Tire and Rubber Company. Drafted into the U.S. Army, Lew volunteered for flight school, becoming a noted helicopter pilot and working aircraft maintenance during two tours in Vietnam. He stayed in the Army and eventually retired in 1986 as a Major. Lew earned his bachelor's at University of Nebraska at Omaha and his MBA at Adelphi University, applying this education to his post-military career at Northrop Grumman in Sunnyvale, managing three departments, Production Control, Production Systems, and Production Planning from 1986 until retirement in 2001. Despite career success, his greatest inventions were for fun, including converting aluminum Bud Light cans into flashlights, and using them as object puns. "Want a Bud Light?" "Need a light?" His daughters on multiple road-side occasions have praised that he taught them how to change a tire.

In retirement, Lew enjoyed traveling overseas with Shelley, on cruises, and in their motorhome across the U.S., all while continuing to play regular games of bridge with friends, work on repairing and restoring classic cars, and volunteering, often in leadership roles, through organizations such as the Al Kaly Shriners of Colorado Springs, CO, the Escalon Masonic Lodge #154, the National Camping Travelers Club- Gold Panners #154, the Central Valley Corvair Club, the Ultra Van Motor Coach Club, the American Legion, and the Veterans of Foreign Wars. He was an active member of the Camellia Gardens Homeowners Association.
