Windshield update

Below is a quote we have received for new windshields. This is a \$24,550.00 project plus freight to get 20 windshield sets created and in crates. Individual sets in cartons.

5/16" Thick, clear annealed laminated safety glass, bent to customers irregular radius pattern, approximate block size: 48" x 22" + shape cut + seamed edges.



I received the new shift cable and will install it at the end of May when we can work on the Ultra Van outside as I don't have a protected garage available. Also, I plan to change out hoses and belts and work on interior renovation. There are problems to deal with including the front tires rubbing plus getting the Ultra Van registered in Illinois from California. The current title says SALVAGED and that has been a problem. Good news- it is running, and I have taken it on a short test drive. I doubt I will have it ready for the June Rally, but I do plan to come and meet everyone.

Ken Mitchell #503

I am about to start my restoration of #503 next week.

Steve & Laura Lemke #409

We have been making good progress on #247 and we started ramping up the project shortly after the rally.

Dad was trying to save weight, so he decided to use thin laminate panels to cover the



walls, but this proved to be a poor idea as they started to warp and crack. I searched for a lightweight alternative and found 1/8 underlayment panels at Home Depot which looked pretty good with just a coat of polyurethane and were flexible enough to even make the curves under the dash.

I reinforced the walls near the seats and have added 3-point seat belts for safety.

We installed a magnetic pickup for the speedometer but had problems with the signal dropping out due to misalignment of the rear control arm and half shaft during suspension travel. The fix was a GPS speedometer drive from Autometer.

The hydraulic throttle actuator we installed was problematic at best and I never trusted it and fixing it on the side of the road would have been difficult, so we went back to a throttle cable and a surface mount accelerator pedal from JEGS.

Since the coach was going to have hand controls, we installed an electric over hydraulic power brake system. After two master cylinder failures I've decided to scrap it and have gone back to a manual brake system with front disc brakes.

Dave Beck and I were talking about a warning system if the cooling fan stops turning which seems like a really good idea, so I have installed a pressure sensor in the fan

shroud with a warning light/buzzer in the dash if that happens.

Now the fun really starts. We got all of the modifications completed, I started the coach up to take a test drive and had a lifter clacking, which I have never heard before. Shortly after that it began to misfire and started making some really awful noises. Further inspection revealed a dropped valve seat on #2 intake valve. I knew I wouldn't have time to repair the motor and finish the inside in time for the rally so Michael LeVeque to the rescue. New valve seats, polished the crank and some fresh bearings and we we're back in business, or so I thought. I was getting ready to reassemble the driveline and noticed the torque converter bushing was shot as was the shaft on the differential. Clarks did not have the shaft in stock, but Michael did! Well, as long as we are in there, we are going to install a set of 3.89 gears in hopes of being able to climb the Tennessee hills a little better. I decided the 57-year-old transmission might as well go too so I have ordered a replacement from Clarks.

Laura and I are still planning on having the coach at the rally in June. The inside should be mostly complete, and we are hoping to at least have the outside in pri-

mer. We have already made reservations and the worst case is that we will be there with an SOB (some other brand)!

The first drive of the year for our Ultra Van #389 was March 15, 2023, which was a sunny dry day here in cen-

tral Indiana. This would be the first 220 miles we would drive following our tow home from Tennessee last October after dropping the #5 intake valve seat. It would

also serve as a celebration, of sorts, for our 49th anniversary the following day. It is always a breath of fresh air to get out and do something a little different long about this time of year while waiting for true Spring weather and this day trip was no exception with many smiles, picture taking and thumbs up from passersby. We also had some interesting Corvair stories from people as we stopped at Amish meat mar-

kets, diners, and gas stations. We chose a route through southern

Indiana which had some rolling uphill roads, some interstate, and some county roads in preparation for the trip in June to the Wisconsin Dells Ultra Van National Rally and following CORSA Convention.

The newly refreshed engine, differential and power glide all seemed up to the task as before, however, as usual there was an unusual happening with the right front shock absorber becoming disconnected from the upper mount. This caused the need to drive slower and some harsh sounds with every dip in the road. The good thing was repair could wait until we got home but requires removing the front seat for access, not the end of the world and fortunately no damage to the shock which would require removing the coil spring if the shock needed replaced.

I have never had a cylinder head temperature gage before so I installed a dual instrument with thermocouples on each head, one in the #1 area and the other #6 area where the factory sensor would normally be. The "J" type thermocouples were meant to go under spark plugs but mount well with a bolt holding them in place. It has been quite interesting to see just how fast that temperature changes going up at highway speeds and quickly down in city driving. Thanks to my friend Chris Brown #328 for the idea and providing the thermocouples.

ULTRA VAN PART IV

The late winter and spring of 2022 I worked many hours preparing the Ultra Van for paint. I replaced the panel in front of the driver's side bedroom window because it was dented



and had a hole in it. I stripped all the paint off the top down to the belt line with airplane paint stripper. It was a nasty job, but it saved me from sanding around the rivet heads which I did a lot of front and rear. On a lot of the lower body, I used the stripper on the rows of rivets. The most time was spent on the four fiberglass corners of the body. The rear was the worst and took the most time

sanding and filling. It seemed like a week on each one and I should have spent more time for sure., I had a little near disaster when I had the local welding shop try to patch a hole in the rocker panel outside the bathroom. He didn't notice that a piece of foam rubber had dropped down from the wall, and it caught on fire. Fortunately, he had a hose handy and put it out right away but not before it warped the panel and did paint damage in the already completed bathroom. Thanks to my wife, she got the bathroom cleaned up and repainted while I continued prepping the body for paint. The fire happened 5/24/22 and we were leaving for the Ultra Van Rally on 7/3/22. I only had nights and weekends to get it painted until I started my vacation in the middle of

June. By the last week of June, it was in primer and ready to paint. On Saturday afternoon, the 25th I brought the Gene telehandler home from work. My good friend Roland Martel, who was a body shop manager at Grappone's Ford in Concord, NH for years plus he worked at Knoxland Equipment painting for us, had volunteered to help me paint it on Sunday morning. It was supposed to be a nice cloudy day in the 70's. I asked him if he wanted to paint the roof or

run the handler. He said he would paint and let me run the handler. So, we started after 10 am with me mixing the paint and running the lift while he did 90% of the painting. I painted mostly the lower parts laying on the ground. Unfortunately, when we started painting the roof the sun came out and it was too hot to paint. So, I backed the Ultra Van under the trees in the shade. Then the wind came up and blew stuff out of the trees, but considering everything it came out well.

So, I had one week to get it back together to make the trip to Elko, GA by Wednesday. It was ready for the trip minus the two Minnesota Mining Gold Stripes. We let the paint dry while Judy, Rocky and I went to the Nest & Rest Campground in Thetford, VT for a trial run camping before we headed for Elko, GA. It went great! We headed back home. I put the stripes on and loaded things for Elko. We left out early Sunday morning with the Browns in chase with their 23" Class C Camper, towing a Chevy HHR.

Ultra Van Part V

When I retired on December 31, 2022, I had two semi major jobs left to do on the Ultra Van. When we drove it to GA last summer, I found out it needed front shocks. I had bought them last fall, which were easy to get since they are the same as the Chevy II or Nova. I dreaded starting the project because the shocks are inside the coil springs which are bolted along with the upper shock mounts to an aluminum housing that's part of the unibody and not removable. But to my surprise when I got my courage up in February to tackle the project, I jacked the front of the Ultra Van up, borrowed Bob Brown's spring compressors and took the passenger side apart and I was amazed! The 4 bolts on the spring and shock came out like they were put in the day before; the treads were perfect. The lower mount for the spring

and shock had a rubber bushing in it and being 56 years old I got to thinking that I should replace it while I had it apart. I ordered the new spring mount with new bushing from a speed shop in CA which they claimed was in stock, but it took the best part of a month to get. This gave me time to tackle my next project on the Ultra Van refrigerator which will be in my next article. So, by the time the new spring mounts arrived I had all

out. I was ready for assembly, and it went quite well. After that side was finished, I went to the driver's side. That side was a different story only one of the bolts came out almost as easily as the passenger side. Two of the next three came out after lots of heating and PB Blaster penetrating oil and one had a piece of aluminum thread on it, which was not good. The third bolt broke off, but it was through a 1" spacer so I removed the spring and shock assembly. Then I could get at the bolt much better with heat, so I heated it up cherry red, let it totally cool and used my stud remover and it came out

the components blasted and repainted that I had taken



with an aluminum thread also. I ran a tape through the three holes in the aluminum to clean them out. I installed a new bolt which seemed loose to me, but I decided to use Red Loctite on those three bolts. Of course, I used new grade 5 bolts on both sides, torqued to specs, so the ones with the red permanent Loctite will have to be heated to remove. I haven't driven the van since, but it should be fine.

The Refrigerator Project (While I was waiting for front end parts)

The front sill that the bottom of the door seals against was totally rusted out. I had used Gorilla duct







tape against the foam insulation on the trip to GA and it seemed to work fine. But to finish the restoration I knew it needed to be finished in steel like the original. Before I started on the shocks, I analyzed how I could weld a new piece in to make it like new and I really got discouraged because of two things. One was that I would have to remove the original carpet to remove the refriger-

ator and, I would have to remove the plastic lining of the refrigerator before I did the welding. So, I decided to fix it in place with new metal and my old friend JB Weld. With a Dremel tool small cut off wheel I proceeded to remove all the rusted parts of the refrigerator's front frame. I then took measurements and the small, rusted pieces to Mike at Merrimack Sheet metal. He made me a new sill frame piece and short pieces of the side frame out of galvanized while I waited. When I got the pieces to fit the frame that weren't rusty, I welded the short piece of the side frame to the bottom sill. I had taken two pieces of sheet metals.

rusty, I welded the short piece of the side frame to the bottom sill. I had taken two pieces of sheet metal and made 2 strips about 3" long to fit inside the frame channel. I used the Dremel to grind the inside of the original frame and used the JB Weld on the two strips plus I used a good amount of high-quality



silicone between the insulation and the frame. I used the door to clamp the frame in place. I waited 16 hours. The next day I opened the door, and everything was solid.







By then the parts had come in for the shock and spring mounts, so my attention shifted back to the Ultra Van.


