Ernest Newhouse Award



Each year the Ernest Newhouse Award has the opportunity of being presented. It is important that you read the criteria below for the award and even MORE important you read about submitting a nomination. Please read everything below **CAREFULLY!**

The award recognizes an Ultra Member who has contributed in an outstanding manner to the progress, enjoyment, and general success of The Club and its activities, and meets the qualifications as stated below. Basis for selection will be the individual's performance during the entire period of membership; not just limited to the previous year or any other shorter time period.

To qualify for nomination of this award, the individual must have done **four** of the following six items:

- 1. Host at least one National Rally.
- 2 .Hold a chair position of a committee
- 3. Hold at least one term as a club officer, tech, or other club position.
- 4. Be a member of The Club for a minimum of two years.
- 5. Host at least two regional rallies, or a second National Rally.
- 6. Accomplish outstanding or superior services to The Club.

A written, qualifying report (not just their name) must be reviewed by the President for each nominee for verification before the ballot is published in the April newsletter (**NO** write-ins). The President will forward each qualified report to the newsletter editor for inclusion on the ballot. Members vote by ballot, preceding or during the National Rally. Presentation of the award occurs at the National Rally. A tie vote selects the individual with the longest Club membership. An individual may receive the award only one time (see your Roster for past recipients)

Again, don't assume someone else will do it. Please send by April 1, 2024.

Also, I had some muffler tail piece replaced per the State Safety Testing Agency I am dealing with in order to get registered in Illinois, which has not happened yet but is getting close.

Now I am getting a lot of residue from the existing gas tank that clogs the fuel filter relatively quickly and I'm not sure how to try to clean out tank. It may need to be replaced which I don't want to do if possible. Also working with the carburetor to slow down the idle. Cleaning and adjusting it. A work in progress!

I am rebuilding a rear wheel bearing so I can carry it in the coach with me, just in case. I have installed a backup







camera and replaced worn out front steering bushings. I also removed, sandblasted,

and painted the outside rear view mirrors on UV #499. I removed the toilet and the rusted-out ring collar hold down and replaced it with an ABS unit. The toilet was bolted back down, and it is sturdy now. Then I took the Powerglide shift cable out and wrapped it <u>really well</u> with silicone Rescue Tape. No leaks yet, (fingers crossed). Also, I installed a gen/fan light on the instrument cluster so I can know right away if the belt comes off. I put in a new distributor as one of the screws was stripped. I also installed a green light on the instrument cluster so I can tell when the signal lights are in use and will be notified to turn them off after the turn. Finally, I was tired of stripped screws going into the thin tin for the license plate light, so I installed some Rivet Nuts aka riv nuts and they work well.

November Ultra Adventure

In a nutshell: November 3-5, Gloria & I were invited to attend the "Indiana Bus Club Invasion" with our Ultra Van. This was a 3-day camping event in southern Indiana with a Pirate theme sponsored by VW van/camper owners.



Last October while attending a horse event with 12-year-old Vivian, our granddaughter, at the Hendricks Co. IN. fairgrounds I wandered over to the "Vocotober Fest", an annual VW car show with over 100 VWs of all kinds from as far away as Chicago. While talking with one of the club

officers he explained they had 107 camping spaces reserved at the 55-acre, Bill Monroe campground just

outside Nashville, IN. and we should register for one of the 11 spaces left, so I did just that. When I explained that the Ultra Van wasn't a VW, he said, "yes, but it is air cooled". I taped VW badges on the front, back and on the baby moon hub caps and as we entered the campground this seemed to confound many VW Westfalia van owners.

The campground was previously owned by the now deceased mandolin playing "Father of Bluegrass" Bill Monroe where he built the Music Barn in 1939. In the



day it was one of the 3 locations in the US where everyone who was anyone played country but especially the (Continued on page 9) (Continued from page 8)

more recent "bluegrass sound". In the newly renovated music barn, which is now a museum, we saw a contract for \$75 paid to Johnny Cash to perform, a piano played by Jerry Lee Lewis, and hundreds of costumes worn by now famous country artists. Elvis was very early in his career but persuaded Mr. Monroe to let him record Bill's song "Blue Moon of Kentucky". The royalty paid Mr. Monroe .06 cents for each copy sold. The recording sold 4 million copies and earned Mr. Monroe \$250,000 in the 1950's. Also, in the 1950's over 50,000 people came to hear the concerts





causing the national guard to be called out for traffic control. These were the days before much television, and social media could show such things and people attended in person. The governor of Indiana told Mr. Monroe to start holding his concerts over several days to control the crowds, so he did, resulting in over 15,000 people daily over the next 8 days!

Another story was about a young man named Jerry Garcia (of the Grateful Dead) who hitchhiked from his home out west so he could audition to be one of the Blue Grass Boys of Bill Monroe's band. With less than \$7 to his name Jerry was forced to sleep outside for a month while waiting for the band to return from a road tour. You can still see the pine tree Jerry slept under. As it turned out Jerry did not make the cut and was told to get more practice. Mr. Monroe gave him a ride on the tour bus as far as Missouri and Jerry found his way back home from there. However, as Paul Harvey would say, the rest of the story is that Jerry Garcia later in life said, "I may not have been a Blue Grass Boy BUT now I can pay for one!" On the property you can see the original outdoor stage where many concerts were held along with the nearby 3-hole men/women outhouse which was used by the likes of Dolly Parton and others. All these stories and many others were told by Rex Voles as he and the other 40 of us rode the hay wagon that cool moonlit night making 8 stops to explain the history of the property. The final stop was to show us where he, as a 15-year-old boy, lived on the adjoining farm and hopped the fence to see the performers. Rex started hauling trash for Mr. Monroe and now owns the property. Before his death in 1996 Mr. Monroe started a legacy fund sponsored by music lovers to give scholarships to young artist to further their music careers. A true credit to his passion for music and the people around him, Bill Monroe left his formal education at the 5th grade level and was orphaned at age 17.

All 3 days of the event were filled with pirate costumes, food, and lots of music with 2 live bands playing till

midnight. Parked in the campsite next to us was Randy Coburn who once owned UV #379, so we had lots to talk about. There was even a guy with an amazing telescope

where we could view 4 of Jupiter's moons, the rings around Saturn, and a peek at our neighboring galaxy Andromeda. All this and we were only 90 miles from home. It is an interesting country we are blessed with.


